### A MESSAGE *from the Pastor*

#### *Why We Need Advent*

In case you missed it, we started a new church year in church. I know it seems odd to follow a different calendar than the rest of the world. But the church's worship life follows different markers from the life of Jesus.

We are beginning with the four-week-long season of Advent as a time of preparation to celebrate Christ's birth, make room for him in our lives, and expect his return at the end. Until then, we'll follow a cycle of Sundays and festivals retracing the life, death and resurrection of our Savior and Lord. To me, it never seems to get old. I always discover something new and it's always new. Recently I was contemplating the ambivalence of feelings about Christmas.

**Does Christmas still bring you joy each year, or are there times you feel guilty about not catching the spirit? It's okay to be honest, especially during Advent.**

Christmas is a joyful celebration. But we don't always feel joy, in our own lives and also about the state of the world in general. But you know, it was the same during Mary and Joseph's time. During Jesus' time, God's people had to contend with life-threatening illnesses and a worse economic situation than most of us. If Christmas music on the radio or in stores makes you wonder why you don't feel joy, then you need Advent. Because Advent is designed to be a time of hope, expectation, and preparation for change.

God will bring peace and joy—even in the midst of worries, suffering and confusion—that's the promise of Advent. Christ's Christmas birth was God's sign of hope. Our acts of kindness bring joy in the tough times we experience. And our worship throughout Advent and the rest of the church year continues to encourage us.

*"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." (Romans 15:13, NRSVue)*

We need Advent. Use Sunday worship, weekly (online video) devotions, and a free ELCA calendar to prepare for hearing the good news of Christmas—that our Savior has come into our world of darkness to bring us to God's light.



The ELCA Gathering is a faith formation experience like no other for Lutheran high school youth. It provides young people with experiences that will challenge and strengthen their faith and give them a view of the larger church. After cancellation of the 2022 event, there will also be a new component for young adults.

The theme for the 2024 Gathering is "*Created to Be.*" Our primary Scripture will be Psalm 139, with a specific emphasis on verse 14: "I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well."

The national youth gathering will take place July 16-20, 2024 in New Orleans. Pastor Munker will be excited to prepare and take teens who will have finished 8<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> grade and/or young adults ages 18 to 35 from our congregation together with other chaperoning adult leaders.

## ST PAUL'S *Alive*

### Is Becoming ST. PAUL'S *Wide Open*

Our church is alive by being *open* for all. Earlier in the fall, Pastor Munker and our church council discerned where we as a congregation are, what challenges we experience, and what gifts our congregation has for renewing ministries for sharing the good news of God's grace in our community.

The apostle Paul wrote about his own example: "*We have spoken frankly to you ... our heart is wide open to you.*" And he expressed hope to reach others: "*Pray ... that God will open to us a door for the word, that we may declare the mystery of Christ.*" (2 Corinthians 6:11, Colossians 4:3, NRSVue)

Now it will be your turn to help us discern practical activities we can realistically, creatively, and courageously commit to trying out in the coming year. Rather than forming a committee or making a 10-year long-range plan we will rely on the Holy Spirit and all of our members to help *open* our church to others.

- + St. Paul's church council is working with Pastor Munker on next steps and is considering the possibility of a **Congregational Workshop** to introduce the initiative to *open* St. Paul's by inviting and welcoming all. Watch for special announcements, and pray about your contribution to outreach and inclusion.

Each week, a rotating group of volunteers for our Ladles of Love ministry prepares and serves carry-out meals and a personal item.


- Anyone is welcome to pick up a free lunch and gift at the St. Paul's church driveway on Wednesdays from 11am-12noon.
