

A MESSAGE from the Pastor



Easter Hope for Good Fridays

Did you get the full Holy Week experience? If not, you truly missed something. Sorry! It's like watching the first season of your new favorite Star Wars show, and then skipping to the season finale. It's awesome, but you miss how Mando or Ahsoka got there and once again saved the galaxy.

In order to fully appreciate the real joy of Easter, you really need to have gone through the experience of Holy Week.

There is just nothing like leaving worship in silent darkness on Good Friday after Jesus' suffering, death, and burial—and then returning again to church transformed by decoration, sunshine (hopefully), and joyful hymns to celebrate the good news of Christ's resurrection. Now, I know it may be too late if you missed it. But there will be next year. And in the meantime, you still need Easter hope for Good Fridays.

We all have days when life feels like there is not a ray of sun, joy, or hope. It might be because of plans not working out, the car breaking down, and frustrated arguments in the family. Or classmates, coworkers, or strangers at the store being mean. Or bad news about a friend's or grandparent's death. :-(Do you have unshakeable, sustaining, and restoring hope for such days, situations, or entire seasons in your life?

There is hope! :-) You only have to believe it. Of course we cannot make ourselves believe or feel hopeful. It's ultimately a gift of the (Pentecost) Spirit. But Jesus' resurrection brought hope to his disciples, and their witness can encourage us as well. If God can raise Jesus from the dead, then no circumstance is beyond God's control. There's always going to be another tomorrow—until Jesus returns again.

The apostle Peter assures us that faith in the resurrection gives hope for times of adversity: "May the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ be blessed! On account of his vast mercy, he has given us new birth. You have been born anew into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. ... You now rejoice in this hope, even if it's necessary for you to be distressed for a short time by various trials. This is necessary so that your faith may be found genuine." (1 Peter 1:3, 6-7, CEB)

+ Dear friends, <u>it's not too late</u> to learn how the good news of Easter can change our lives with hope through faith in new beginnings, second chances, and a better future. *Worship* and a special *Video Study* during the Easter season will help all of us trust in God's love, presence, and power for days when nothing goes right and no end is in sight. 
ST. PAUL'S Annual Spaghetti Supper

SYNOD Listening Campaign AND Strategic Planning Process

All Members Are Encouraged to Attend

Your participation is vital as to how the Spirit is calling us to participate more deeply in God's mission. This process is about listening for God's will and not about listening for our will. Bishop Busboom invites all of us to pray for openness to hear what the Spirit is saying, for wisdom to listen, and for the courage to act.



PARISH NURSE Ministry

Blood Pressure Checks and Wellness Information

Lew McDonald takes blood pressures and provides information at church before and after worship, usually on the first Sunday of each month. Be sure to check in with Lew on April 7, and thank him for his ministry.

This month, Lew shares with us about doing a "Bathroom Mirror Self-Exam" to be aware of potential health concerns. There are eight total areas to focus on, which will be split up into parts over the next few issues of our newsletter.

Bathroom Mirror Self-Exam (part 2 of 4)

From the curve of your back to the spots on your skin, you can learn a lot about your health from a close inspection in the mirror.



Mouth

What to look for: Plaque, a sticky bacterial film that contributes to gum disease. Purchase some disclosing tablets—chewable tablets that temporarily stain plaque a bright color like pink or blue. After chewing, look for any colored spots; use a mirror to see the back of the teeth. Call your dentist if concerned. Early-stage gum disease is usually reversible with a professional cleaning and an upgraded oral hygiene routine; late-stage gum disease, called periodontitis, is not.

Throat

What to look for: Lumps or bulges while swallowing. These could signal thyroid trouble, including hypothyroidism (which means an underactive thyroid), hyperthyroidism (an overactive thyroid), thyroid cancer, or a goiter (an enlarged thyroid). Have a glass of water nearby. Using a handheld mirror, zero in on the lower front area of your neck. Take a sip of water, tilt your head back slightly (keeping your eyes on the mirror) and swallow, looking for any bulges or lumps that appear in your neck. Don't confuse your Adam's apple for your thyroid; the thyroid sits below the Adam's apple, closer to the collarbone, and is generally not visible unless something is amiss. If so, your family physician, internist, or endocrinologist can examine your neck and order any necessary tests.

How Do CHURCH AND STATE Relate?

A social statement on "Civic Life and Faith," the relationship of church and state and related matters, is under development

across the ELCA. A draft social statement is now available at $\underline{www.elca.org/civicsandfaith}$. Your feedback will be accepted through September 30, in preparation for a scheduled vote during the churchwide assembly in 2025.

A WORD OF Caution

Recently, some members of St. Paul's received **spam messages** purportedly coming from Pastor Stefan. They were fake! Someone was apparently using his identity and asking for favors and gift cards.

<u>Do not reply</u> to or comply with unusual or suspicious messages. <u>Look</u> for telltale signs, for example spelling errors, strange e-mail addresses, and unusual but vague and urgent requests. <u>Remember</u>, never give out personal information online, or send gift cards for payment or donations.

Our pastor will never ask for money directly. Only give at church, use our St. Paul's payment service Tithe.ly, or make a transfer through the bank.

If you have any concerns, contact the sender directly and separately (*not* as a reply to the suspicious message). Pastor Stefan has checked his account security and changed passwords, but the scammers may still send messages for a while. Mark suspicious messages as spam so other messages like it can be flagged and minimized.
